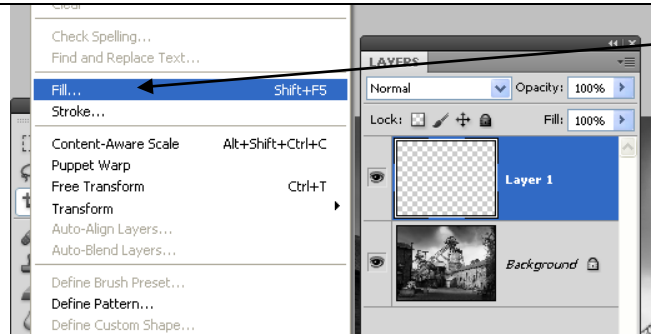


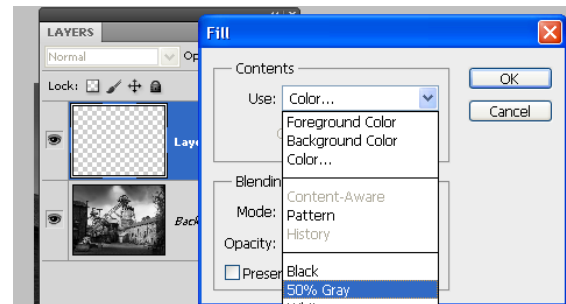
Toning using Layers

Toning a Monochrome image can be done in many ways but the following method allows the image to be toned to any colour or effect with the use of the “opacity” of the layer adjustment.

After converting to your basic image to Monochrome image, create a new Layer by clicking onto the upturned corner icon “**create a new layer**”.

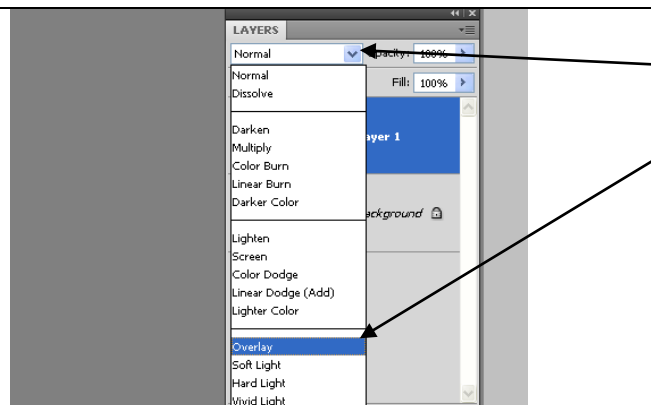


Under the **Edit** tab (in Photoshop) select **Fill**.



Then go to **contents use; color . 50% Gray** ok.

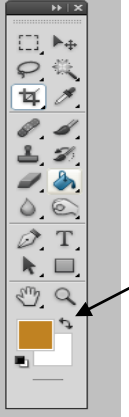
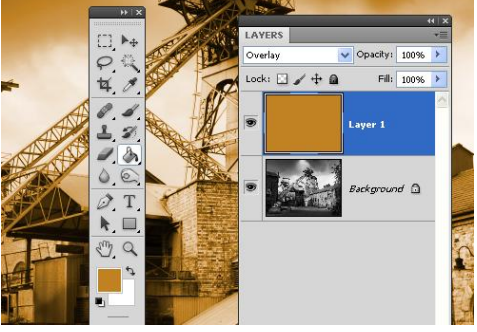
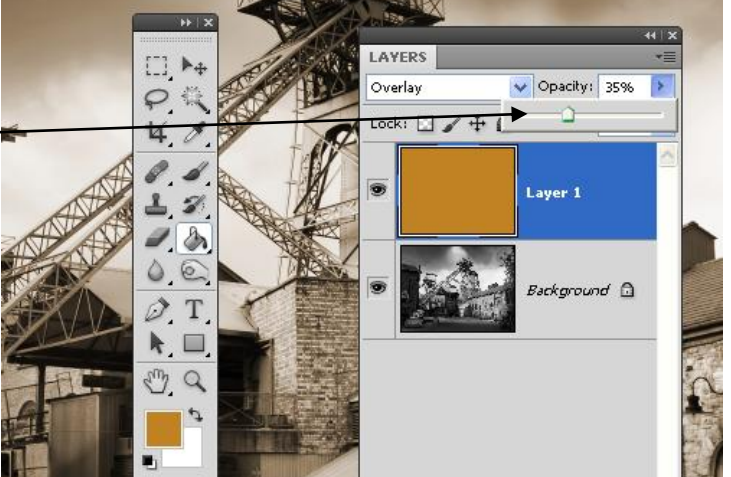
The layer will turn Gray.



Click onto the down tab on the blending mode and select **Overlay**.

Using the colour Picker (click on the Foreground/Background Squares) or by using the **Swatches** which will be found under **Window** .Select a colour.

For Sepia select and orange.

 <p>Colour obtained from colour picker when clicked onto the foreground square.</p>	 <p>Using the Paint bucket tool colour the layer</p>
<p>Now you have a very orange image so adjust the Opacity until you get the depth of sepia that you want.</p>	
<p>By adding a Red Layer on top of your orange layer in the same way as before (new Layer, Fill 50% gray overlay, colour) you could turn your image copper.</p>
